WHY A SPECIAL CONVENTION?

The Board voted unanimously on 11 March 2023 to hold the 2023 Convention in Amsterdam as a Hybrid Special Convention.

To meet the deadline, it shall be announced as a Special Convention and convened as such. Since the Special Convention shall also have to decide on an amendment to the Charter, a quorum (presence) of 2/3 (two thirds) of all European clubs is required.

If it is established that the quorum is not reached at the opening of the first Special Convention, then the KI-E asbl statutes allow that shortly thereafter (without a time limit) another (second) Special Convention is convened with the same agenda as the first Special Convention.

So, if in the first Special Convention, the quorum is not reached, a second Special Convention shall be called - fifteen minutes later, with the same agenda.

In addition, when the first Special Convention is called, it shall be explicitly pointed out that voting, and the counting of votes, will be done digitally for those physically present as well as for those online. This shall also be explicitly announced at the beginning of the first Special Convention. The President shall only formally open the first Special Convention. Immediately after the opening of the first Special Convention, the President shall immediately request the determination of the number of attendees from the Chair of Elections.

If the quorum is not reached, then it shall be clearly determined that the Special Convention does not have a quorum and, as already announced, a second Special Convention with the same agenda will be held fifteen minutes later with a quorum of at least 150 delegates.

There shall be an explicit reference to the unanimous decision of the Board of 11 March 2023 and the first Special Convention shall be closed due to lack of quorum.

There should not be any speeches or addresses by officials and guests between opening and closing the first Special Convention.

If any guests hold speeches between the Special Convention, it shall be announced to the attendees that these speeches are not part of the official Special Convention.

This shall also be recorded accurately in the meeting minutes.

After the fifteen minutes have elapsed, the second Special Convention shall be opened and proceed according to the agenda. Here immediately after the opening the unanimous resolution of the Board of 11 March 2023 shall be pointed out.

AUDITORS' REPORT ON THE 2021/22 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

We have been appointed as auditors of KI-E A.s.b.l, 4 rue Camille Mersch, L- 5860 Hesperange (Grand Duchy of Luxembourg), in application of §13.3 of the articles of association of KI-E.

In accordance with the terms of our appointment, we have audited – partly with a video conference – the accompanying financial statements of KI-E A.s.b.l as of and for the year ended September 30, 2022, which show a balance sheet total of EUR 649.536,- and also the annual total negative result with an amount of EUR -17.435,-.

The previous MOU Contractual Program has been terminated.

The financial statements 2021/2022 are the full responsibility of the members of the KI-E A.s.b.l Board. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit activities.


We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made, as well as evaluating the overall financial statements presentation.

We have provided recommendations regarding the discharge of the auditors, the follow-up of the insurance policies, the start-up of KCF Europe and the close monitoring of operational costs.

We have obtained from the Treasurer Jan de Jonge the explanations and information necessary for performing our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of KI-E A.s.b.l as of September 30, 2022 and of its results for the year then ended.

Biography

I have been a proud Kiwanian since 1997 and, thanks to the support of my wife and children, have been able to hold many positions of responsibility. The highlights were my year as governor of the largest European District (Switzerland-Liechtenstein) as well as my year as president of Kiwanis International-Europe. During these years, I was able to get to know and appreciate many Kiwanis International employees.

Describe your Kiwanis moment – the moment you knew you were a Kiwanian.

In my 25 years of membership, there have been so many great moments that it is hard to pinpoint one in particular! I have seen so many children's eyes shine so brightly just because of our involvement!

Why did you decide to run for office?

Our organization is facing major challenges. Structural changes will probably be inevitable. In Europe, the process has already begun. As European president, I was very much involved in the reorganization sought and desired by Kiwanis International. I would like to bring this unique experience to the organization.

What qualifies you to become an officer of Kiwanis International?

My strength is that, in addition to being a former governor of the Switzerland-Liechtenstein District, I was also able to serve as president of Kiwanis International-Europe. Furthermore, as a business economist in the private sector and as a municipal president in politics, I have been able to acquire a great deal of specialist knowledge. Furthermore, I can communicate in several languages.

What do you hope to accomplish during your term in office?

For an organization like Kiwanis, it is essential to be active in all geographic regions and welcoming to different cultures and ways of thinking — knowing that these can sometimes represent a challenge compared to what is lived at home. We must succeed in breaking the negative trend. Basically, Kiwanis needs to become a more modern organization. We must stop being so traditional!

What strengths do you bring to the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees?

I think that teamwork is a strength that has the potential to be undervalued. The ability to work well as a part of a team — taking responsibility where necessary and deferring to others when required — is a skill I am proud to have. Throughout my career, I have worked with a variety of teams on a vast range of projects.



STANDING RULES FOR THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Rule 1

The official language of the Convention shall be English. Simultaneous interpretations shall be available in several languages.

Rule 2

Only delegates with official delegate badges may be present or speak on motions and vote.

Rule 3

Only delegates may be seated in the area designated for delegates.

Rule 4

The House of Delegates shall not be closed.

Rule 5

Any main motion or amendment shall be written in English, signed by the maker and seconder, and presented to the KI-E Secretary before it is moved.

Rule 6

No delegate may speak more than three (3) minutes at a time, unless allowed to do so by the orders of the day or by a majority vote of the delegates.

Rule 7

No delegate may address the assembly a second time on the same question until all delegates who desire to speak on the topic have spoken.

Rule 8

The maker of a motion shall be entitled to speak first in support of such motion or may immediately yield the floor to another delegate.

Rule 9

Debate shall alternate between those speaking for and those speaking against a motion.

Rule 10

Microphones shall be designated by number. Speakers for the main motion shall use the odd-numbered microphone, and speakers against the main motion shall use the even-numbered microphone. The chair will recognize microphones in rotating order.

Rule 11

A delegate shall not speak for or against a motion and move to close debate on the same recognition.

Rule 12

Candidates for the office of International Trustee shall have a nomination speech not to exceed one (1) minute, and shall personally address the House of Delegates for no more than three (3) minutes.

Rule 13

Candidates for the office of KI-E President, President-elect and Vice president shall have a nomination speech not to exceed one (1) minute, and shall be allowed a two (2) minutes acceptance speech.

Rule 14

Candidates whose remarks require other than simultaneous interpretation shall be allowed no more than six (6) minutes for their remarks and interpretation combined. Candidates must provide their own interpreter.

Rule 15

Any candidate who is unopposed for office may be elected by applause.

Rule 16

Nominating speeches for KI-E officers and International Trustees may not be waived.

Rule 17

Debate on any proposed resolution or amendment to the KI-E Bylaws, including all amendments thereto, shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes.

Rule 18
